How Our Policy is Applied in Practice

Compliance with the Act on Ensuring Proper Transactions Involving Specified Entrusted Business Operators

- Our procurement staff undergo periodic training to ensure up-to-date understanding of the law.
- They also conduct training themselves to ensure companywide awareness of the importance of compliance.

Signed up to the Declaration of Partnership Building Initiative

- On March 25, 2022, we publicly announced that we had signed up to the government-sponsored Declaration of Partnership Building initiative, which seeks to add value throughout the supply chain and promote harmony and shared prosperity among large enterprises and SMEs.

Control of Chemicals in Raw Materials

- We comply with the Restriction of Hazardous Substances (RoHS) directive and Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH) regulations.
- Chemical substances are strictly managed using SDS/chemSHERPA.

Responsible Mineral Purchasing

- We are aware of the risk that minerals mined or traded in areas of conflict and or other high-risk areas—including tin, tantalum, tungsten, gold, and cobalt—may be a source of human rights abuses, environmental destruction, conflict, and social injustice, including child and forced labor.
